TILESTON MUSIC CENTER

Imagine transforming 48-50 Tileston Street, a 2,200 square foot building nestled in historic North End and just steps from the Prado Studios, into a state-of-the-art instructional arts facility. With soundproofed studios, dedicated one-on-one lesson space, a beautiful community gathering space, and large classrooms for group instruction, NEMPAC will reach new heights.




MAKE SPACE FOR ART




FIRST FLOOR
